
We conducted our audit in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States*. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statement. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the District Court # 43-4-01, as well as evaluating the over all financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

The financial operations of the District Court # 43-4-01 are conducted and reported in accordance with specific instructions of the *Pennsylvania Department of Revenue and the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts*, which reporting method is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles.

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Monroe County Controller's Office Compilation Report


To Magisterial District Judge Brian Germano, District Court # 43-4-01:

We have audited the statements of cash receipts, disbursements and undisbursed funds of the District Court # 43-4-01 for the year ended December 31, 2013, and have issued our report thereon dated December 12, 2014.

We conducted our audit in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

Compliance with laws, regulations and specific instructions of the *Pennsylvania Department of Revenue and the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts* is the responsibility of District Court # 43-4-01's management. As a part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of District Court # 43-4-01's compliance with certain provisions of laws and regulations. However, the objective of our audit of the financial statements was not to provide an opinion on overall compliance with such provisions. Accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.

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Monroe County Controller's Office Report on Internal Control

To Magisterial District Judge Brian Germano, District Court # 43-4-01:

We have audited the statement of cash receipts, disbursements and undisbursed funds of the District Court # 43-4-01 for the year ended December 31, 2013, and we have issued our report thereon dated December 12, 2014.

We conducted our audit in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement.

The management of the District Court # 43-4-01 is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure. In fulfilling this responsibility, estimates and judgments by management are required to assess the expected benefits and related costs of internal control structure policies and procedures. The objectives of an internal control structure are to provide management with reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that assets are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, and that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly to permit the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Because of inherent limitations in any internal control structure, errors or irregularities may nevertheless occur and not be detected. Also, projection of any evaluation of the structure to future periods is subject to the risk that procedures may become inadequate because of changes in conditions or that the effectiveness of the design and operation of policies and procedures may deteriorate.

In planning and performing our audit of the statements of cash receipts, disbursements and undisbursed funds of District Court # 43-4-01 for the year ended December 31, 2013, we obtained an understanding of the internal control structure. With respect to the

internal control structure, we obtained an understanding of the design of relevant policies and procedures and whether they have been placed in operation, and we assessed control risk in order to determine our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements and not to provide an opinion on the internal control structure.


We noted no matters involving the internal control structure and its operation that we consider to be reportable conditions under standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Reportable conditions involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of the internal control structure that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the organization's ability to record, process, summarize, and report financial data in a manner that is consistent with the assertions of management in the financial statements.


A material weakness is a reportable condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements being audited may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions.

Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might be reportable conditions and, accordingly, would not necessarily disclose all reportable conditions that are also considered to be material weaknesses as defined above.

This report is intended for the information of the District Court # 43-4-01, and the Board of Commissioners of Monroe County. However, this report is a matter of public record, and its distribution is not limited.
