New Meal Selection at Senior Centers

We are excited to announce our new partnership with **Ryan's Deli**. This food provider will be serving the congregate lunches at our senior centers, taking the place of Monroe County Meals on Wheels. Ryan's Deli is based in Lords Valley, PA and has been serving the senior centers in Pike County since 2020. Their meals are prepared and packaged in a commercial kitchen prior to being delivered. They are only served hot, so there will no longer be a cold salad or light meal option. All meals are designed to be heart-healthy, with limited sodium.

In the fall, the Loder Senior Center took part in a pilot program during which a selection of Ryan's Deli's meals was introduced. The food received very positive feedback; participants enjoyed the quality, taste, freshness, and flavors.

As of now, the meals cost \$1.50 each, but we anticipate increasing the rate to \$2.50 in January. Meal orders are placed each Wednesday for the following week. Be sure to call your senior center (phone numbers on Page 6) by this day to make a reservation. If you miss the cutoff, please do not let that stop you from coming! We will try to keep a few extra meals at each center.

As we introduce the new menu across all our centers, our goal remains the same: to provide nutritious, well-balanced meals that our participants truly enjoy.

We would like to thank everyone who shared their feedback during the pilot phase, and we extend our appreciation to all our food service partners for their ongoing commitment to serving Monroe County's older adults with care and dedication. Your feedback helps us keep improving. We are grateful to all who shared their thoughts and appetites!

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

LIHEAP helps income-eligible families pay their heating bills by issuing a grant that does not need to be repaid. The one-time payment is sent directly to the utility company or fuel provider, and it is credited on the bill (though, in some cases, the check may be mailed to the applicant directly). Cash grants range from \$200 to \$1,000

and are based on household size, income, and fuel type. LIHEAP also provides crisis grants for emergency situations—applicants can receive more than one crisis grant, as necessary, each season until the maximum benefit of \$1,000 is reached.

Due to the federal government shutdown and lack of federal funding, the 2025-2026 LIHEAP season opening is delayed until December 3, 2025, contingent on availability of federal funding. If the federal government does not reopen or funding is not released to states, Pennsylvania will be unable to begin the normal LIHEAP season until funding is received. The LIHEAP season will open once the shutdown ends.

Last Chance to File for the 2024 Property Tax / Rent Rebate

Homeowners, renters, and some residents of personal care / nursing homes may be eligible for a rebate of up to \$1,000 on their paid taxes or rent. Applicants must be 65 or older, widows/widowers 50 or older, or 18 or older with a disability. The money issued is based on the applicant's annual income, which must have been \$46,520 or less in 2024.

The deadline is December 31st. Apply online on pa.gov, or request an application by calling the Aging Office at (570) 420-3735.

Free Tech Support

Having trouble navigating your devices (cell phones, laptops, printers, etc.)? East Stroudsburg Area School District's Community Technology Outreach Program is made up of a dedicated group of techsavvy students who are willing to work with community members to answer any technology-related questions. Once month during the school year, students teach participants about common technologies and additionally offer one-onone sessions for individualized assistance, encouraging attendees to bring their personal devices, moving them toward a better understanding of the tools they own and use.



Open Enrollment Updates

Our office recognizes the stress and anxiety that Medicare beneficiaries go through each year during the Open Enrollment Period. Our appointments for this year are completely full, and we are not taking any more appointments before December 7th. This year, several plans in our area will go away as of December 31, 2025, and so those beneficiaries will need to enroll in a new plan for 2026. I would like to review some important points regarding Medicare enrollment periods. Please read the next few paragraphs carefully, as you might find that if you missed the Annual Open Enrollment Period, you may just have another chance to review and pick plans!

- 1. The Medicare Annual Open Enrollment Period runs from October 15th through December 7th each year. This is the time when Medicare beneficiaries can do the following:
 - a. Review and change Medicare Part D (prescription) plans.
 - b. Review and change Medicare Part C (Medicare Advantage) plans
 - c. Pick a Medicare Advantage (Part C) Plan if they are not currently in one.* (*Please Note: You do NOT need to have a Medicare Advantage Plan, especially if you have a supplement, known as a Medigap plan.)
 - d. Reminder for next year! Call to make your appointment for a Medicare Review on September 15th. We begin filling our schedule in advance, and it fills up fast!
- 2. If your Medicare Advantage Plan is ending on December 31, 2025, you may still be able to get an appointment with us between December 8th and December 31st to pick a new plan for January 1, 2026.
- 3. There is a Medicare Advantage Open Enrollment Period! From January 1st through March 31st each year, Medicare Beneficiaries who have Medicare Part C (a Medicare Advantage Plan) will be able to review their plan and make a change back to Original Medicare OR change to a new Medicare Advantage Plan. The catch to this is that you must already be in a Medicare Advantage Plan in January to participate in this Open Enrollment period.
- 4. If you receive assistance like Medicaid, Medicare Savings Plan (when the state pays for your Medicare Part B premium), Extra Help (federal assistance paying for medications), or PACE/PACENET (PA's state pharmaceutical assistance), you may be able to change your plans more than once a year. Consequently, if you find out that you are losing one of these programs due to a change in your income, you will also be given another opportunity to change your Medicare plan.
- 5. If you are New to Medicare, you have 7 months in which to enroll in Medicare plans. The 7-month period includes the 3 months before your birthday month, your birthday month, and the 3 months after your birthday month.

I would like to remind everyone that PA MEDI (Pennsylvania Medicare Education Decision and Insight) is a free service provided through the Department of Aging through our local Aging Office. If you are looking for assistance with your Medicare needs, please contact the Monroe County Aging Office at (570) 420-3735 and ask for a PA MEDI referral. We are here to help! Thank you.



The History of Candy Canes

Candy canes have been around for hundreds of years. They started out as plain, white sugar sticks that were likely used in the 1600s as pacifiers. In 1844, the first recipe for these candy sticks was published, and a few years later, the sticks were first used to decorate Christmas trees. It wasn't until around 1900 that the red stripes and mint flavors were added.

Nobody knows for sure how candy canes started being shaped like shepherd's crooks, but one story is that a choirmaster in Germany asked a candymaker to shape the candy this way to keep children quiet during Christmas Mass. Due to their shape, candy canes were laborintensive to make, fragile to ship, and therefore expensive, especially in the early 1900s. In the 1950s, Gregory Harding Keller invented the Keller Machine, which automatically turned straight candy sticks into candy canes, and made them more affordable.

Today, candy canes are a symbol of Christmas and continue to be enjoyed by all ages!
