

MONROE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS March 20, 2024

The regular meeting of the Monroe County Board of Commissioners was held Wednesday, March 20, 2024, in the Commissioner's Public Meeting Room at the Monroe County Administrative Center with the following present: Chairman John D. Christy, Vice-Chairman David C. Parker, Commissioner Sharon S. Laverdure, Solicitor Deborah L. Huffman, Chief Clerk/Administrator Robert J. Gress, Administrative Secretary Cindy Cook.

Chairman Christy called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. with a moment of silence and pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Chairman Christy recessed the regular meeting at 9:34 a.m. to convene an Assessment Board meeting for corrections to the duplicate.

WHEREAS, 4-H is America's largest youth development organization, supporting nearly six million youth across the country; and

WHEREAS, 4-H has helped 400 youth in Monroe County to become confident, independent, resilient, and compassionate leaders as they learn by doing; and

WHEREAS, 4-H in Pennsylvania is delivered by Penn State Cooperative Extension in rural areas, small towns, and cities in all 67 counties of the Commonwealth to more than 77,000 youth ages 5–18; and

WHEREAS, 4-H youth in Pennsylvania are served by a network of staff members and more than 6,000 adult volunteers who engage and mentor youth in learning activities and hands-on projects in topics such as animal science, civic engagement, STEM, and health and wellness; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania 4-H Week showcases the incredible ways that 4-H inspires kids to achieve and highlights the remarkable 4-H youth in Monroe County who work each day to make a positive impact on those around them; and

WHEREAS, 4-H's network provides youth with opportunities for leadership development, career exploration, problem solving, friendships, community involvement, passion, and purpose

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, colon and rectal cancers are one of the most frequently diagnosed cancers in Northeast Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, incidence rates in some areas are as much as 17% higher than the U.S. average; and

WHEREAS, about 75% of new cases of colon and rectal cancer occur in patients of average risk; and

WHEREAS, approximately 516 new cases are diagnosed, and about 200 patients die from colon cancer each year in the counties of Lackawanna, Luzerne, Monroe, Pike, Susquehanna, Wayne, and Wyoming combined; and

WHEREAS, the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute has been easing the burden of cancer in Northeastern Pennsylvania for over 30 years through community and patient services, hospital and practice support services, and cancer surveillance programs specifically designed to meet the unique needs of our region; and

WHEREAS, on Thursday, March 28, 2024, the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute will sponsor the 21st annual C.A.S.U.A.L. (Colon Cancer Awareness Saves Unlimited Adult Lives) Day to increase colon cancer awareness throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, C.A.S.U.A.L. Day was established by the family of Helen Phillips, who fought a courageous battle against colon cancer and died in the summer of 2002.

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Monroe do hereby urge residents of Monroe County to be screened for early detection of colon cancer, participate and support the Northeast Regional Cancer Institute in its colon cancer awareness efforts, and designate the month of March as Colon Cancer Awareness Month and March 28, 2024, as C.A.S.U.A.L. Day in Monroe County.

Chairman Christy reminded everyone about Community Night being held on April 30, 2024, at Northampton Community College in Tannersville from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Chairman Christy asked for public comment. Theresa Pesce from Effort, PA spoke about the \$71,000.00 contract with Clear Ballot and stated it is for software and licensing it does not include the cost of the machines which she states was about \$600,000.00. Ms. Pesce also commented on the Fiscal Year 2023 State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program. She stated that while the funding through the grant program may not be coming out of the county budget, it is coming from the federal and state budget which means the taxpayers are still paying for it. She also mentioned that Albert Sensors have been monitoring internet activity for years. (Albert Network Monitoring & Management is part of Center for Internet Security.)
