

Changes to our Volunteer Program

For thirty-five years, the AmeriCorps Seniors Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) has been a vital part of our community, inviting older adults to use their life experience and skills by serving their neighbors in need. In addition to a grant from AmeriCorps, the Monroe County Commissioners and the Monroe County Area Agency on Aging have shared the responsibility for funding this program. Recently, we were informed by AmeriCorps that we will not be receiving the anticipated grant this year.

Although this news is disheartening, we have decided to view it as a new opportunity. The volunteer program is not ending. We will be changing the program's name and office location, but Neal Gallagher will remain the Volunteer Coordinator, and the program's functions will remain much the same. The program will now operate from the Loder Senior Center building on 62 Analomink Street in East Stroudsburg. Their phone number has not changed; it will still be (570) 420-3747.

Throughout its operation, RSVP has partnered with more than eighty community organizations, meeting the needs of older adults facing challenges and providing an outlet for those looking for a meaningful way to use their time and talents. Among other things, volunteers drove patients to critical medical appointments, grocery shopped for and socialized with the homebound, provided support to local food and clothing pantries, wrote cheerful notes to nursing home residents, and made small safety home repairs. In 2024 alone, volunteers served nearly 30,000 hours, which equates to nearly \$1 million in important benefits and services to the community.

We will take all we learned from RSVP and make a program that will continue to have a positive impact in Monroe County. We sincerely appreciate all our volunteers who make this possible, and we're excited to see what the future holds!

2025 Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program

Summer is right around the corner, and with the warm weather comes fresh fruits and vegetables! The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) will be offered again this year in Monroe County. This program encourages older adults to eat more fresh, locally grown fruits and vegetables, and is made possible through the PA Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Food Assistance.

SFMNP provides \$25.00 in vouchers to seniors. Please eligible note: Department of Agriculture, NOT Monroe County Aging Office, sets the dollar amount of the vouchers. Monroe County Aging Office will be administering the program beginning Tuesday, June 3, 2025, at various sites throughout the county. Please also note: the vouchers will NOT be mailed this This is because only 61% of the year. vouchers distributed by mail last year were redeemed. This was the 3rd lowest redemption rate in the state and left thousands of dollars unspent.

The vouchers can be redeemed at farmers markets throughout the county from June 1st through November 30th. A list of farmers markets will be provided at the distribution sites.

Seniors residing in Monroe County who are 60 years of age or older and who have a gross income at or below \$28,953 for a single individual and \$39,128 for a married couple are eligible to participate. Proof of age and residency is required (driver's license, photo ID, etc.).

If an eligible senior is unable to enroll in -person, a representative can pick up their vouchers if they have a signed and completed proxy form. You may only

receive the vouchers once per season. The vouchers will be given on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Romance Scams

The world is more connected than ever before thanks to the internet. Social media and dating websites allow us to stay in touch with old friends and make new ones. However, this increased connectivity can also be dangerous. Scammers have more opportunities to deceive and exploit unsuspecting victims.

romance scams. criminals make convincing fake profiles, often using stolen photos and creating elaborate backstories. Once contact is made with their victim. scammers invest time and attention into building a relationship, creating emotional bond that feels authentic. They isolate their victims from their family and friends by discouraging contact, making it harder for the victim to seek advice from loved ones. After establishing trust, scammers introduce seemingly urgent financial crises, which can look like medical emergencies, unexpected legal troubles, or unforeseen travel expenses. They then ask for money as a loan or gift to help them with their problem.

Older adults are particularly vulnerable to this scam because they often experience loneliness or a desire for companionship, so scammers often target people who are widowed or divorced. Also, older adults who aren't very familiar with the internet may be more trusting and less familiar with online dangers, making them unable to recognize deceptive behavior. Seniors also may have more assets or savings that scammers look for, making them an attractive target.

Romance scams are more prevalent in our area than you may think. Our Protective Services team gets these calls frequently about seniors in Monroe County.

Never send money to an online love interest, whether that be cash, gift cards, wire transfers, or cryptocurrency. You won't get it back!



SHARE Housing is an affordable housing choice that brings together home hosts who want to share their home with home seekers who are looking for housing in exchange for assistance with living expenses, help around the house, or a combination of both. The event is free and includes lunch and door prizes. There will be a variety of vendors in attendance, and the Pocono Pony will be available to those needing transportation.





What am I entitled to as a veteran in Monroe County?

Our local Veterans Affairs office offers many benefits for Monroe County veterans. Most of these benefits require a particular period of service and an honorable discharge. The Veterans Pension Program provides monthly payments to wartime veterans. Veterans Discount Cards are available for use at select Monroe County businesses. Some other benefits include:

- \$100 county death benefit for burial of a veteran or their widow
- Grave flag holders and flags for Memorial Day and Veteran's Day and placing of flags
- \$100 headstone installation
- \$75 headstone engraving benefit if veteran's grave already has a headstone
- Free recording of DD214s
- Certified copies of DD214s
- Written correspondence for veterans and dependents involving federal or state benefits
- Grave registrations for veterans buried in Monroe County
- Historical research service



Reading Corner Washington Black by Esi Edugyan

An 11-year-old field slave named Washington Black knows no life other than the Barbados sugar plantation where he was born. When his master's eccentric brother, Titch, chooses him to be his personal manservant, Washington is introduced to new ideas and the possibility of being treated as an equal. Titch is an explorer, inventor, and abolitionist, and he does not agree with his sadistic brother's principles. When Washington is threatened by a false accusation of murder, they abandon everything and escape together on Titch's flying machine. The story follows their subsequent adventures across the globe. The book is written in beautiful prose, and its conclusion leaves no unanswered.
